Holy Week Way of the Cross, Palm Sunday - Easter

A self-guided Stations of the Cross will be placed around the Social Hall. Each station will have an image, a reading, and a prayer. Stations of the Cross is an ancient tradition which started in the first centuries of Christianity. While in the early days, walking the way of the cross may not have been a liturgical, formal event, pilgrims were known to visit sites in and around Jerusalem where Jesus had been known to have spent time and where the events of Holy Week took place. You are invited to spend some time during Holy Week walking and reflecting on Jesus' last days with these images and passages as you are able.

Services will be in-person and livestreamed.

Palm Sunday | April 2 | 9:30 am

We remember Jesus' triumphant ride in Jerusalem and his being taken as prisoner by the Roman authorities.

Maundy Thursday | April 6 | 7:30 pm

On Maundy Thursday we will hear the call by Jesus to serve another and celebrate the Last Supper. This service includes communion, stripping the altar, and hand washing.

Good Friday | April 7 | 7:30 pm

On Good Friday we mourn the death of Christ upon the Cross. Our service will focus on the last words of Jesus. This is a somber service.

The Resurrection of our Lord Easter Sunday | April 9 | 9:30 am

Celebrate and worship the Risen Christ with us during this festival worship service, in-person and livestreamed.

Afterward we will gather in the playground for our Annual Easter Egg Hunt (it will be peanut-free)!

Our Easter Brunch will feature food from CAVA, and will be generously hosted by Fred S.



Call Committee Progress

Before a slate of candidates is provided by the Synod, the Call Committee must prepare a Ministry Site Profile (MSP). The MSP is a standardized form requiring basic statistical information, as well as in depth questions about the Congregation. Below is a brief summary of the discernment process the Call Committee used in preparing the MSP.

Research: We considered where we were (previous MSP) and where we are (2022 congregational survey, transition consultant) to frame the consideration of Trinity's current organizational, relational, and spiritual circumstance

Listening: Members of our committee brought varied historical experiences and interactions with different aspects of Trinity's history, membership, and leadership; we integrated these personal experiences with the information gleaned from our research

Collaboration: We drafted sections of this MSP individually and collectively, refining multiple iterations via group discussion and prayer

The draft MSP was presented to the Council, transition consultant, current interim pastor, and synod for additional feedback, and we prayerfully considered this feedback for the final submission.

The final MSP was submitted in late March. There is no set time frame from the Synod on when a slate of candidates will be presented. Recognizing the Easter Season is a busy time for potential candidates may create a small hurdle, we are optimistic we will receive a slate in the next 60 days.

The Call Committee is excited to move onto the next step of the Call Process. We will keep the Congregation up to date on our progress. Please feel free to reach out to any of us with questions or concerns.

We ask that you continue to keep our call process in your prayers.

2023 Congregational Leadership Opportunities

The 2023 Nominating Committee is seeking suggestions for candidates for Council, Mission Endowment, the 2024 Nominating Committee, and delegates to the Synod assembly in June. These functions are all important ministries within Trinity. During these transitioning, transformational times, your leadership is more important than ever!

If you have questions, are interested in serving, or want to suggest someone to serve, please share your thoughts with one of us: Jeanine B, Tom K, David K, Valerie M, and Nancy N.

Here is a brief description of each responsibility: **Congregational Council.** Oversees the life and activities of this congregation, and in particular its worship life, to the end that everything be done in accordance with the Word of God and the faith and practice of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. Chapter 12 of Trinity's Constitution enumerates the Council's duties. Council terms are three years and members can serve two consecutive three-year terms. Council meets together at least once a month and in periodic planning retreats. **Mission Endowment.** Oversees the Mission Endowment Fund which was created in 1996 for members and friends to give gifts and memorials to the mission outreach of the church. The endowment makes awards to mission initiatives that support the Christian faith, support the community, and support special initiatives of our congregation. Typically, the Committee meets once a quarter. Member terms are three years.

Nominating Committee. Annually prepares a slate of leadership candidates for Congregational consideration and election. Members serve for a term of one year. Members of the Nominating Committee are not eligible for consecutive reelection. (See Trinity Constitution, Chapter 13)

Synod Assembly. The 2023 Synod Assembly, which helps to give focus and make decisions for our Metro DC Synod, will be held in-person, on Saturday June 3, 2023, from 8:00 am to 5:00 pm at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Gaithersburg. This year's theme is "Inspired"!

Trinity Intergenerational Sunday School Buckets Project!

On Sunday April 23rd, we will be putting together emergency clean-up buckets for people that have been affected by natural disasters. These buckets will be sent to Church World Service (CWS) but we need your help. There will be a poster with sticky notes out in the



social hall (take one sticky note for each item you wish to purchase) with instructions if you want to help in collecting the items for the buckets. Items to be collected for each bucket are:

1 4-8 oz pump spray air freshener

5 scouring pads (No stainless steel or pads with soap.)

6 regular sponges 1 large sponge

1 scrub brush

18 reusable, lightweight dry cleaning towels (e.g. handi wipes)

1 50 oz. or 2 25 oz. bottle(s) of liquid laundry detergent

1 16-28 oz. bottle of liquid disinfectant dish soap

1 12-16 oz. bottle of household cleaner that can be mixed with water (no spray bottles)

1 package of 48-50 clothespins

1 100 ft. or 2 50 ft. clothesline(s)

5 dust masks (N95 particulate respirator dust masks preferred; No surgical masks.)

2 pairs of heavy-duty, waterproof dishwashing gloves (latex-free, non-surgical)

1 6-9 oz. bottle of non-aerosol insect repellent
