

Happy Valentine's Day — Remember, You are Dust!



Every now and then, Ash Wednesday falls on February 14, the day we honor Love in our lives. What a wonderful thing it is to contemplate the depth of affection, trust, and oneness that we can experience with another. Love so vital to us that we can't imagine a day without that person — be they a lover, a parent or child,

sibling or friend. It's a painful day for people who are grieving or lonely as they mark what they are missing in their lives. Maybe it's appropriate to mark the day (and our faces) with the ashes of our mortality, remembering the fragility of our life and the lives of those whose presence fills each day with love.

The ashes mark our very faces with death. The cross that will loom heavy in Holy Week is drawn on each of us. This might be the one day of the year when we acknowledge that which we would rather not think about too much. We start the season of Lent with the stark reality that, not only will we die but those whom we deeply love will die. Just imagine drawing the black cross on the forehead of the one whose life and love are so precious to you.

But before we all sink into dark depression as we anticipate the day and the season, Valentine's Day also serves to remind us of the Love that is greater than any love — in fact greater than any other force that exists!

Each Sunday of Lent we will hear stories of Christ's love as it is realized in everyday life among mortals, among people who wear the ashes of the cross no less than do we. On the last Sunday of Lent (Palm/Passion Sunday), we will hear from Philippians 2 about Christ's self-emptying willingness to enter our mortality and hand his own life over to those who would kill him — all for the sake of his love for humanity. Finally we will enter Holy Week and be reminded of Christ's love that is so profound that every person's betrayal is met with forgiveness by this love. And along with the brokenhearted women who find the empty tomb, we witness God's love so fierce that even death is no match.

six Reasons EVERYONE in Church Should Wear a Nametag*

- We all need help with names to minister to one another. For our pastor to be the best church leader they can be, they need everyone's help. Wearing name tags allows our pastor and other leaders to call us by name as they minister to us. Nametags allow us to admit we might struggle with knowing names while providing a way to overcome it.
- Nametags invite conversation and make fellowship more personal. It's simply easier to talk with others when you are on a first-name basis.
- **3.** Nametags save embarrassment. We've probably all called someone by the wrong name, only to realize it later (or perhaps even within the same conversation).
- 4. Nametags are an inexpensive way to promote outward focus. The church that says, "We don't need nametags since we already know everyone anyway" is probably saying more than they care to admit. They may see few guests at their church, and they probably aren't expecting any. On the other hand, using nametags is one way to say, "We expect God to send us guests, and we want to be ready for them."
- 5. Guests feel less conspicuous. Asking only guests to wear a nametag, puts them at a disadvantage in conversations. We know their name, but they do not know ours. Guests should never be the ones who must do the asking.
- 6. Saying to someone, "Please let us know your name" also says, "We want to know you."

Shrove Tuesday

Shrove is derived from *shrive* (to hear confession of, and to assign penance, and absolve someone). refers to the confession of sins as a preparation for Lent, a usual practice in Europe in the Middle Ages. Although the day is sometimes still used for self-examination and introspection, Shrove Tuesday eventually acquired the character of a carnival or festival in many places and is often celebrated with parades. As the final day before the austerity of the Lenten fast, Shrove Tuesday also has many customs pertaining to food. Pancakes are traditional in a number of European countries because eggs, sugar, and fat, commonly forbidden during the Lenten fast, are used up so they will not go to waste; the day is known as Pancake Day or Pancake Tuesday in Ireland and many Commonwealth countries. Similarly rich pre-Lenten treats, sweet *pączki* are traditional in Poland, and king cake is an iconic part of Mardi Gras ("Fat Tuesday") in New Orleans.



Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent. It marks the beginning of a period of reflection and penance. In the Bible, sprinkling oneself with ashes was traditionally a sign of one's sorrow for having committed sins. In the Christian tradition, Ash Wednesday also marked the beginning of preparation for the understanding of the death and resurrection of Christ. The particular symbolism of ashes for this day comes from a practice in the Roman Catholic churches in which the ashes from the palms used in the preceding year's Palm Sunday celebration are blessed. With these ashes, the priest on the first day of Lent marks a cross on the forehead of each worshiper.
