

#### The Great Three Days

Maundy Thursday, March 28, 7:30pm Good Friday, March 29, 7:30pm The Easter Vigil, March 30, 7:30pm

At the fulcrum of the entire church year is The Great Three Days — the span of time in which the salvation of the world is the focus of the Church's contemplation. The Great Three Days is one single liturgy involving the drama of redemption stretching from Thursday evening into the brightness of Easter. Together The Great Three Days proclaim the mystery of our faith: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

#### **Maundy Thursday**

With the setting of the sun on Maundy Thursday, our Lenten observance comes to an end, and we gather with Christians around the globe to begin the three-day liturgy during which we participate in the saving power of Jesus' passing over from death to life.

The heart of Maundy Thursday is Jesus' command to love one another. Just as he washed the feet of his disciples, we are called to follow his example and humbly care for each other, especially those who are in need or unloved and even those who would betray, deny, or abandon us. At the Lord's table we remember Jesus' sacrifice of his life, even as we are

called to offer ourselves in love for the life of the world.

This first liturgy of the Great Three Days has no ending; our worship continues on Good Friday.

#### **Good Friday**

We enter in silence as the liturgy of the Great Three Days continues and we hear the proclamation of our Lord's passion, pray for the life of the world, and meditate upon the life-giving cross.

Together with Christians around the world on this night, we stand before the cross in awe of what God has accomplished through these events. We are keenly aware that it is "for us and our salvation" that Jesus endures this death. We see ourselves in this story. All of our judgments, hatreds, and fears bring this part of the story to its conclusion. In our best moments, we rise to stand at the foot of the cross in solidarity with Jesus. In our worst moments we deny and betray Jesus and we run away. In our worst moments we turn against each other, scapegoating and blaming the other.

The Gospel evangelists wrote the passion narratives out of their understanding of the events and, to some degree, under growing tension in the first century. These ancient texts disturb and unsettle us, and the discomfort points to the burden of our own complicity in the scapegoating and violence.

This second liturgy of the Great Three Days has no ending; our worship continues on Saturday with The Easter Vigil.

#### The Easter Vigil

This night the church celebrates the presence of the risen Lord as he brings us to new life in baptism, speaks his word of promise, and comes to us in Christian community with the first Eucharist of Easter.

The beginning of the vigil centers around fire and light. Fire is one of the primary markers of the human species. Humans have assembled around bonfires for light, heat, each other's company, and to celebrate the wonder of a deity greater than ourselves. When Christians gather on Easter Eve, we acknowledge that, for us, the fire is the light and warmth of the Spirit of the risen Christ, and the company that surrounds the bonfire is his body.

We join this night around the new fire of Easter and, with all of Christ's Holy Church, celebrate his victory over death and the grave. From the new fire we light the Paschal candle and claim Christ's presence in the here and now. Christ is today; his resurrection is now.

The scriptures we read this night offer descriptions of God, metaphors of the resurrection, and references to baptism. The assembly has a vital role as we sing responses to each of the Old Testament readings, following the ancient Hebrew pattern of recitation of text followed by sung response. All the stories and poems we have heard and sung are finally brought to a summary in the proclamation from Paul of Christ's death and resurrection; and our baptism — our death to sin and life to God.

Finally, we turn the corner with our Alleluias of acclamation for the Gospel story of Christ's resurrection. Even our worship space celebrates, with flowers, candles, banners, white and gold and sound and movement as Christ's presence is acknowledged in our assembly! With the first songs of the season, the Easter Vigil is the most celebratory liturgy of the year!

Christ, the true Paschal Lamb, has destroyed death. We join Mary Magdalene and Peter and all of creation to celebrate! Finally we conclude the worship of The Great Three Days and, with Mary Magdalene, we "share the good news," for in the resurrection we know that "Christ is with us."


- 1. Download the AudioFetch app to your smartphone or tablet.


