
As the usher indicates, you are invited to move toward the altar to receive the bread and wine.


Our bread is gluten-free, allergen-free, and vegan. You may eat the bread and then receive the wine by drinking from the first cup or having wine poured from the second cup.





### **HELP WANTED!**

# The Worship Ministry Team Looking for a Few More Volunteers for Important Jobs on Sunday Mornings.

<u>Communion Assistant (adult)</u>: This person assists the Pastor and the Assisting Minister with distributing the wine at communion. You will be needed only during the service on Sundays. You will need to be present in person.

<u>Usher</u>: We sometimes need a second usher for the services, so we'd like to have a few more volunteers. This person greets worshippers, assists them with getting bulletins and finding a seat, and answers questions. In the event of an emergency, you may be needed to assist the nursery attendant or worshippers. You will need to come to the service at least twenty minutes early. You will need to be present in person.

Online Greeter: This person monitors the online chat room as the service is live streamed. They greet online worshippers as they log in and identify themselves, respond to the prayers and other parts of the service in the chat, share God's peace with the folks watching online, and wish everyone a good week at the end of the service. The online greeter sometimes provides updates to the online worshippers in the event of technical difficulties with the audio and/or video on the live stream. You will need to log into the live stream five to ten minutes before the start of the service. While this is ideal for people who worship online, you can also do this while attending in person.

<u>Welcomer</u>: We like to have people work in teams for this role, and we need several more volunteers. This person greets everyone at the door as they arrive on Sunday mornings. They assist visitors with finding their way around the building, answer questions about Trinity, and introduce them to members who can provide more information about our programs. The welcomers work with the ushers to help settle everyone into their seats for the service, and to make sure that children's materials are made available to families. You will need to come to the service at least twenty minutes early, but you are not necessarily needed for the entire service. You will need to be present in person.
